Luna Export Compliance Statement

Luna complies fully with all applicable **U.S. export control laws**, **economic sanctions regulations**, and other **global trade restrictions**. This policy applies to all users of Luna's Services, including our Al software, APIs, models, developer tools, deployment systems, and enterprise features.

U.S. Export Control and Sanctions Compliance

Luna's software and cloud services may be subject to:

- The Export Administration Regulations (EAR) administered by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS);
- The **International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR)** enforced by the U.S. Department of State, where applicable;
- **Economic and trade sanctions** administered by the U.S. Department of the Treasury's **Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC)**.

These laws restrict the export, re-export, or transfer of controlled technologies, software, and services to certain **countries**, **entities**, and **individuals**.

Prohibited Countries and Regions

You may **not use**, **export**, **re-export**, **or access** the Luna platform, Services, or related technologies:

- If you are located in or are a national/resident of a **sanctioned country or region**, including but not limited to:
 - Cuba
 - Iran
 - North Korea
 - Syria
 - Russia (certain sectors)
 - o The Crimea, Donetsk, and Luhansk regions of Ukraine
- If you are identified as a prohibited or restricted party under any U.S. export law.

Restricted Party Screening

Luna's Services may **not be accessed or used** by individuals or entities listed on any U.S. government restricted party list, including:

- Specially Designated Nationals (SDN) List
 (administered by OFAC prohibits transactions with listed individuals/entities)
- <u>Denied Persons List</u>

 (administered by BIS prohibits exports/re-exports to listed persons)
- Entity List

 (administered by BIS designates companies/entities restricted from receiving U.S. items)

You must conduct your own screening processes to ensure compliance before integrating Luna into any systems involving exports, re-exports, or third-party access.

Global Responsibilities

Luna's export compliance obligations extend globally. As a user, you are also responsible for ensuring compliance with:

- Your local or national import/export restrictions;
- Regional controls on dual-use technologies, encryption software, or Al-enabled systems;
- Any licensing or classification obligations in your jurisdiction.

Your Responsibilities

By accessing Luna's Services, you represent and warrant that:

- You are **not** a **citizen or resident** of a country or region that is subject to comprehensive U.S. sanctions;
- You are **not listed** on the SDN List, Entity List, Denied Persons List, or any similar list issued by other governments;
- You will **not use Luna's Services for prohibited end-uses**, including:
 - Weapons development,
 - Surveillance technologies violating privacy rights,
 - o Military or intelligence operations restricted by law.

You also agree not to:

- Export or re-export Luna's software or models into sanctioned territories;
- Share access to Luna's platform with prohibited third parties;

• Incorporate Luna into any project that violates U.S. or international trade laws.

Enforcement and Termination

Luna reserves the right to:

- **Suspend, restrict, or terminate** access to our platform for any user, project, or account that violates this policy;
- Report violations to the appropriate government authorities;
- Audit use cases or customer integrations suspected of export control concerns.

Violations of export control laws may result in severe **civil or criminal penalties**, including fines and denial of export privileges.
